To the Parishioners of Our Lady of Fatima Caringbah

Fr Danai Penollar

Fr Danai Penollar was appointed as Parish Priest of Caringbah in 2015. In 2017 some concerns about his professional conduct were raised with the Archdiocesan authorities. I take all complaints very seriously, and I want to assure people that they are free to bring any concerns about a priest's conduct to my attention. Under NSW legislation, whenever potentially "reportable conduct" is identified, an independent investigation is required, and the priest concerned is asked to withdraw from public ministry while this takes place. Fr Danai chose to use this time to complete some further studies in theology.

The investigation found no evidence of reportable conduct. However, this matter has been very traumatic for Fr Danai, and he has expressed a wish to resign as Parish Priest in order to finalise his studies and undertake some time for personal renewal. He remains a priest in good standing, and I look forward to him taking up a new appointment in the not too distant future.

I thank Fr Danai for his ministry in Caringbah, and for his cooperation with what has been a difficult process for him. I also thank those parishioners who took part in the process. I am sorry that it has taken so long to finalise.
